

## K-3 class sizes in D5 have increased by 13% since 2008-9 from below to above the Contract for Excellence goals



D 5 has largest percent Kindergarten classes of 25 or more in borough yet Kindergarten is MOST important grade to keep class sizes small as possible


### # Manhattan Kindergarten students in classes of 25 or more





Grade 4-8 class size averages in D5 have been erratic but are now above Contract for Excellence goals





### Examples of large 4-8 class sizes in D5





# Percent of D5 K-3 students in a class of 25 or more 2014-15 school year






#### Average School Utilization Rates in D5 are less than City-Wide
