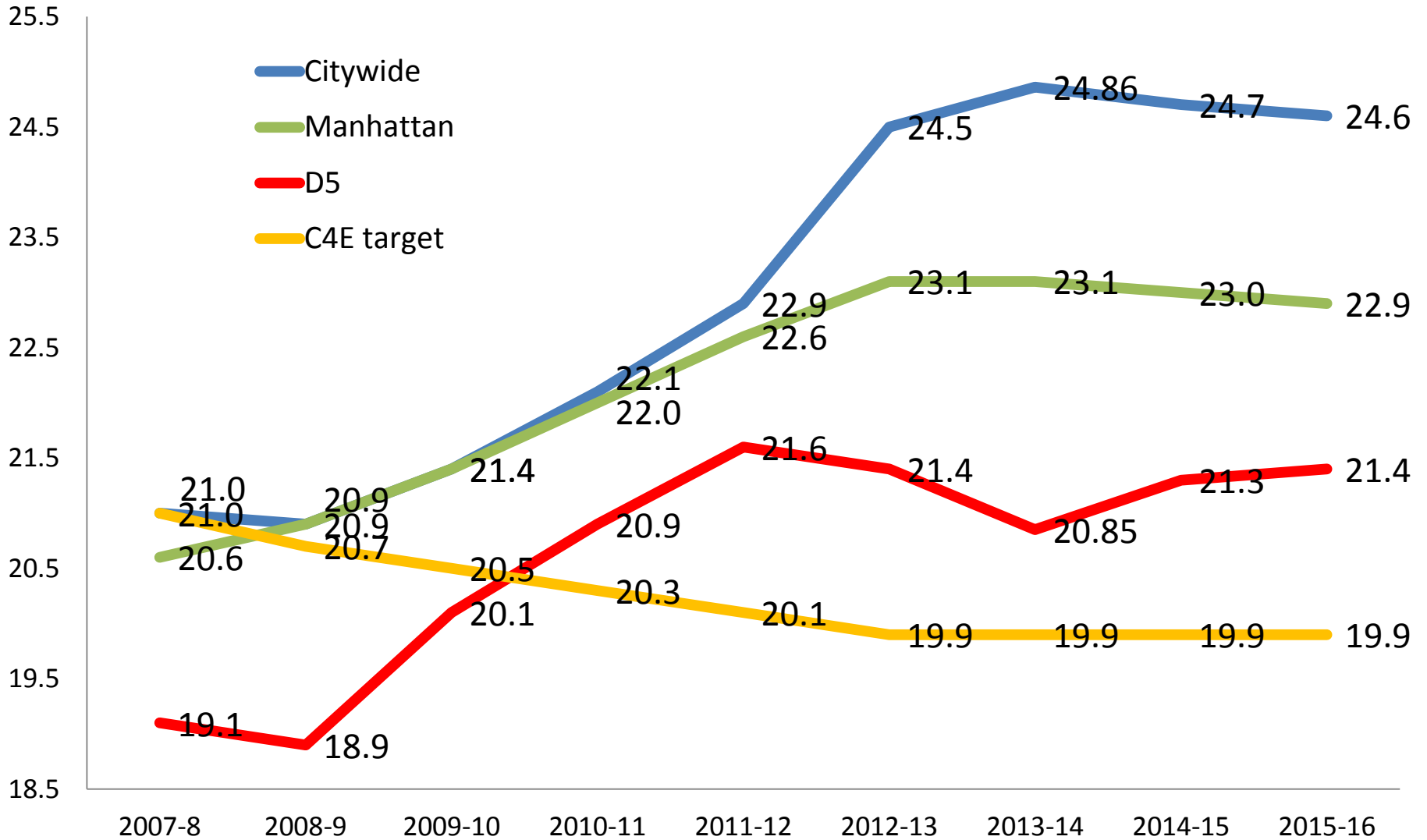

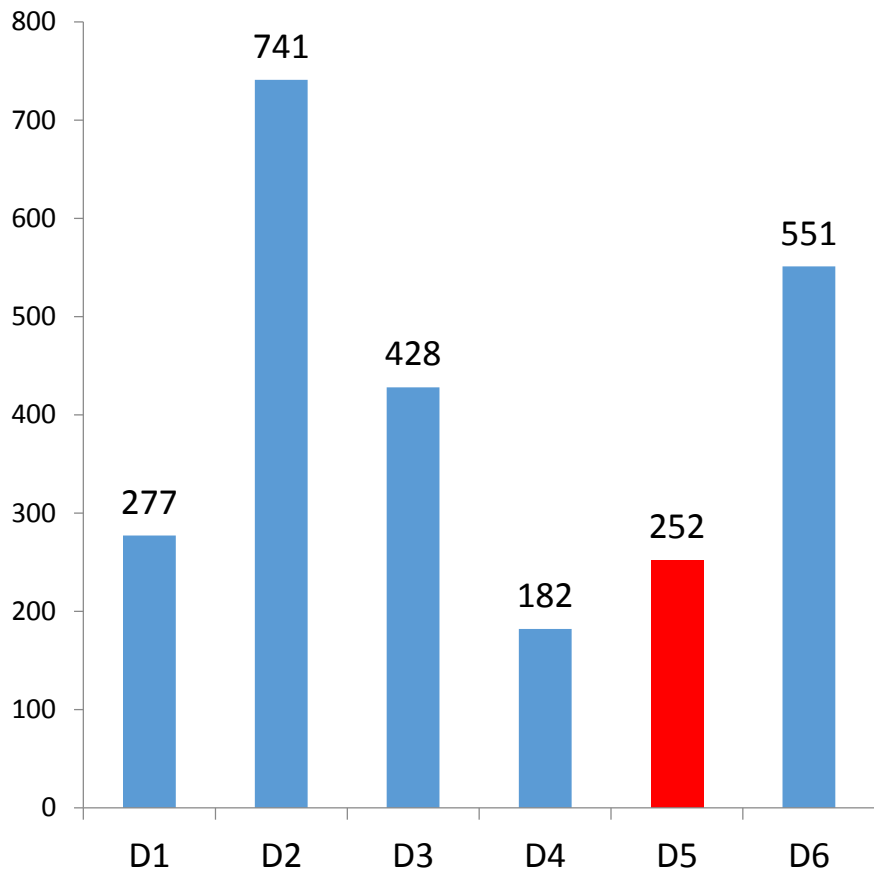
K-3 class sizes in D5 have increased by 13% since 2008-9 from below to above the Contract for Excellence goals



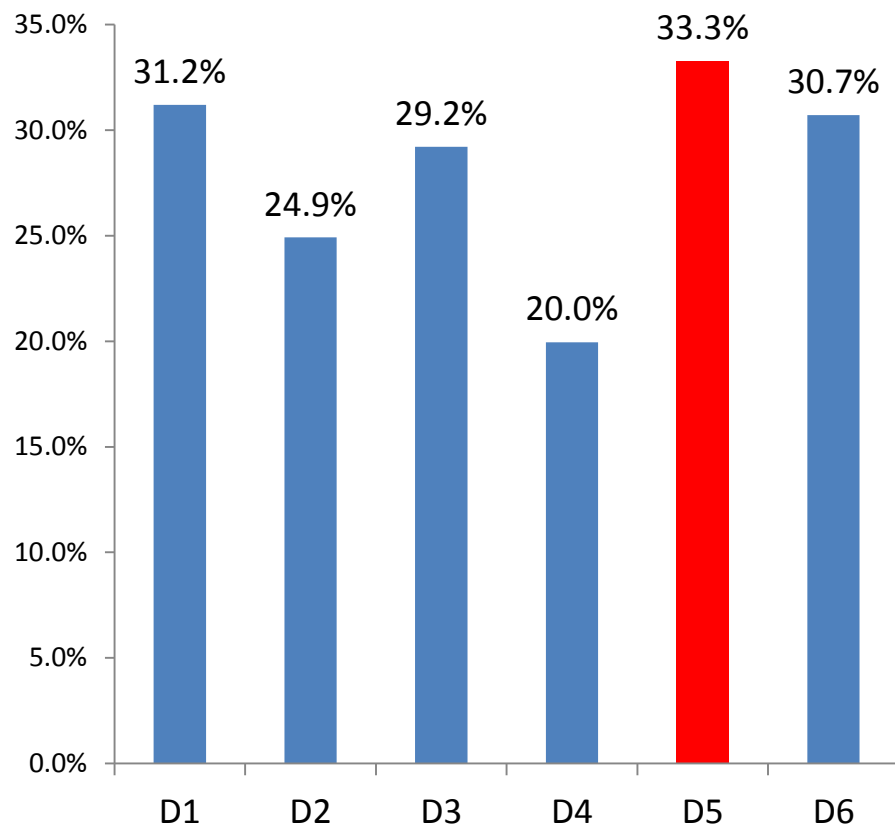

Manhattan Kindergarten students in classes of 25 or more

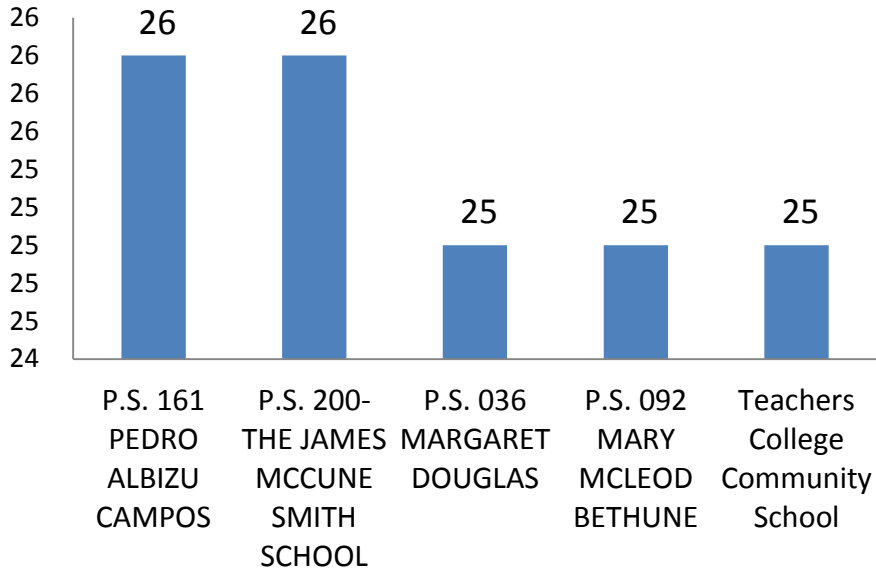


% of Manhattan Kindergarten students in classes of 25 or more

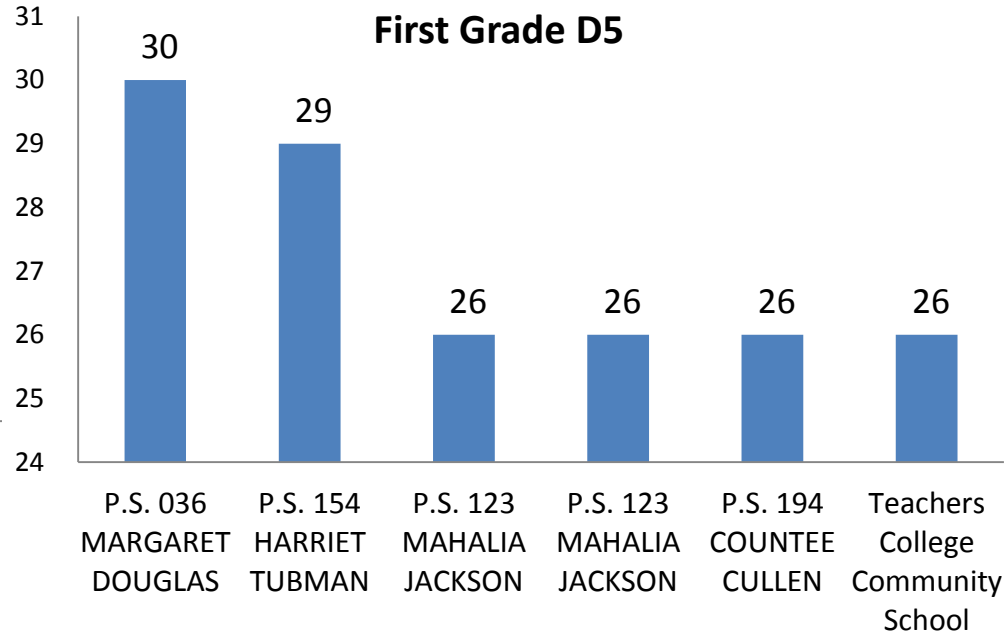

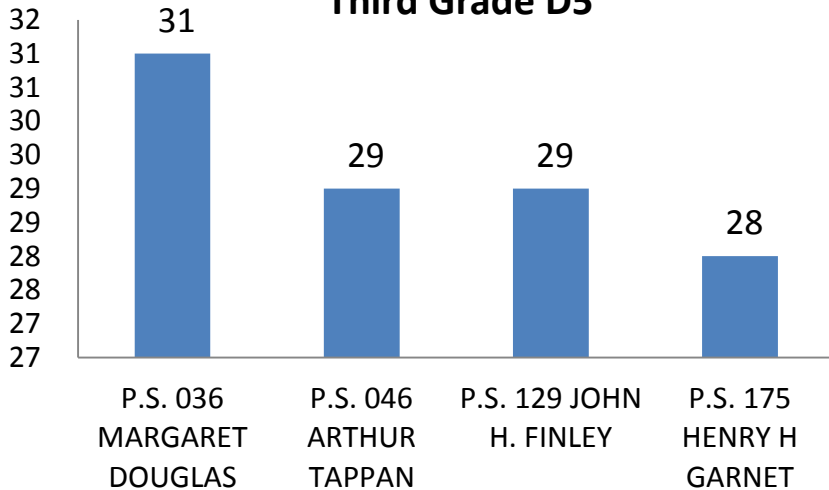

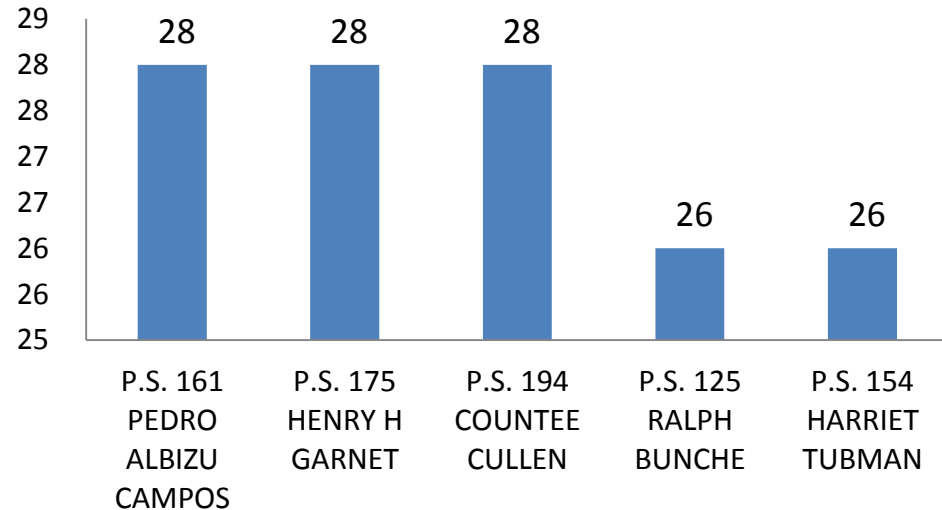
First Grade D5



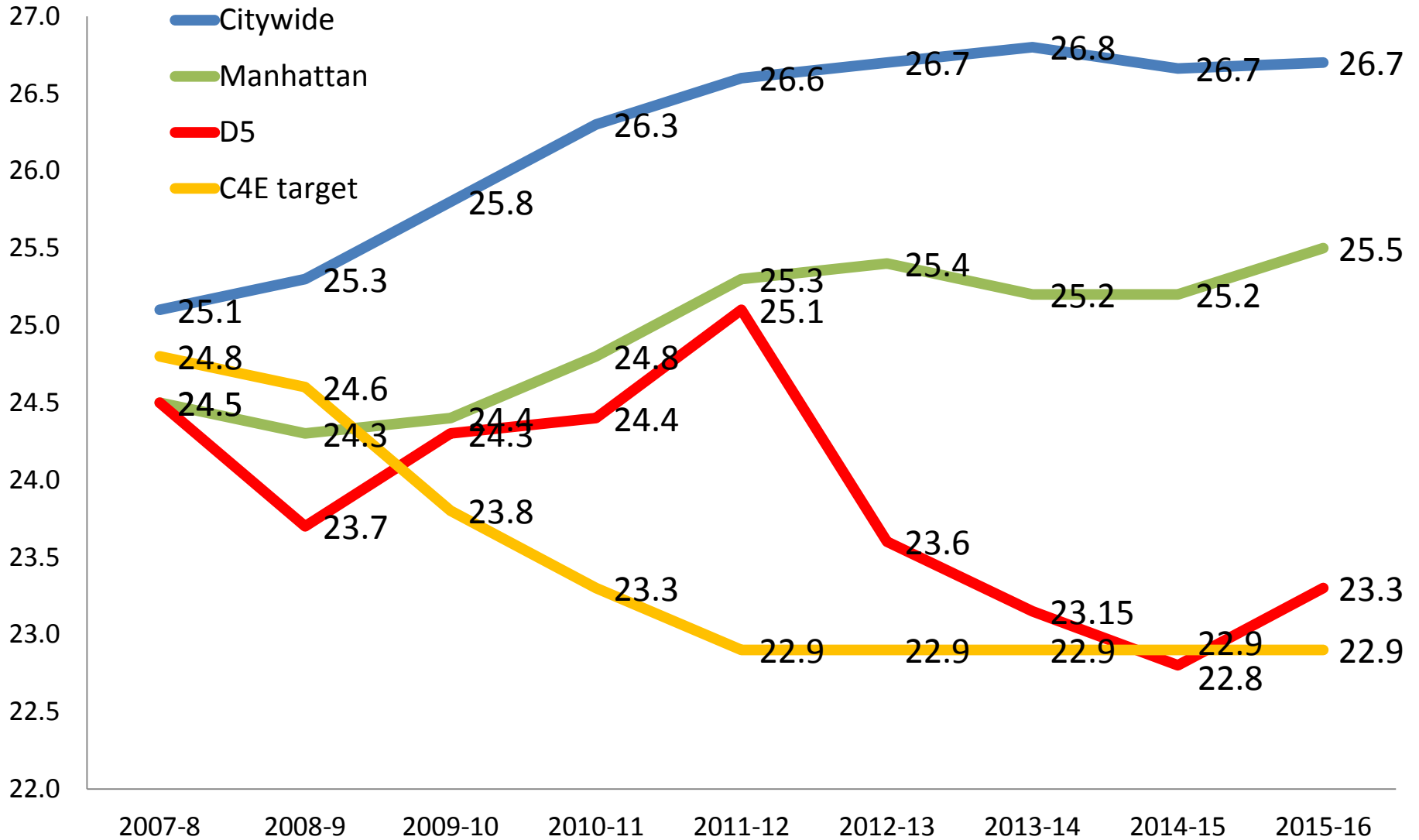
Third Grade D5

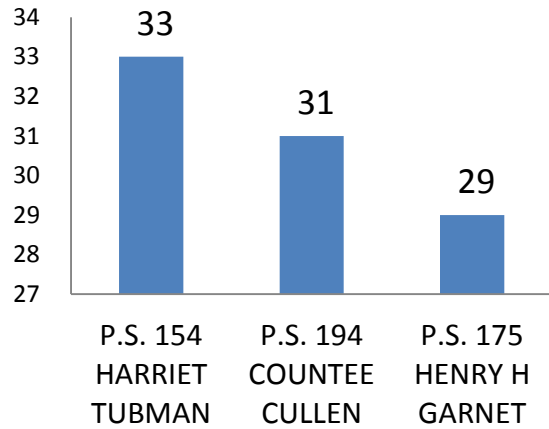
Grade 4-8 class size averages in D5 have been erratic but are now above Contract for Excellence goals



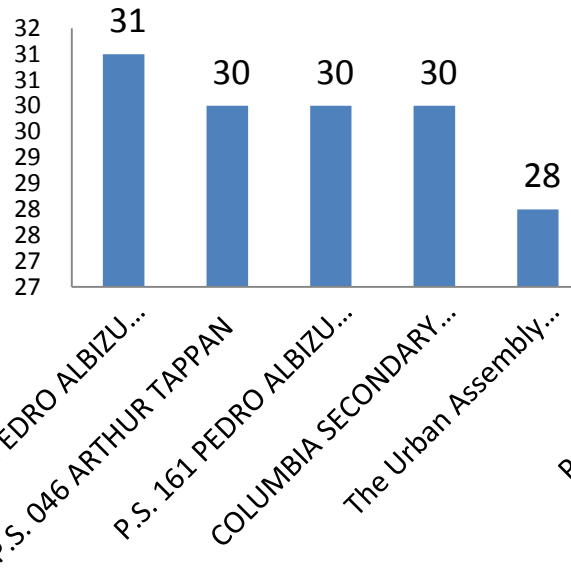

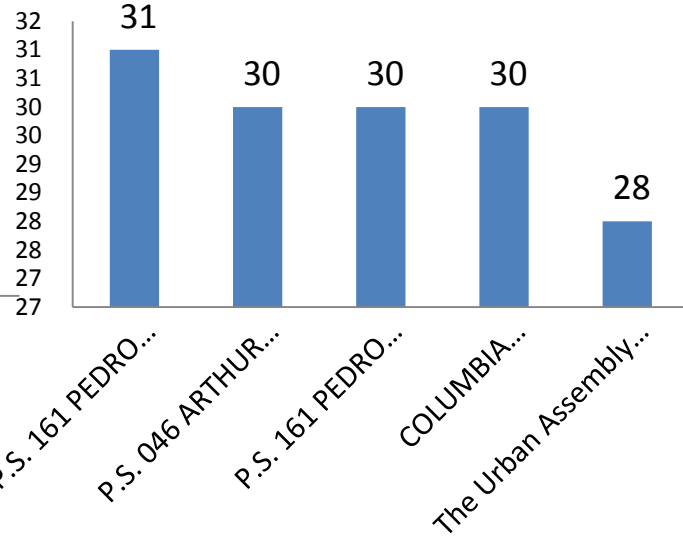

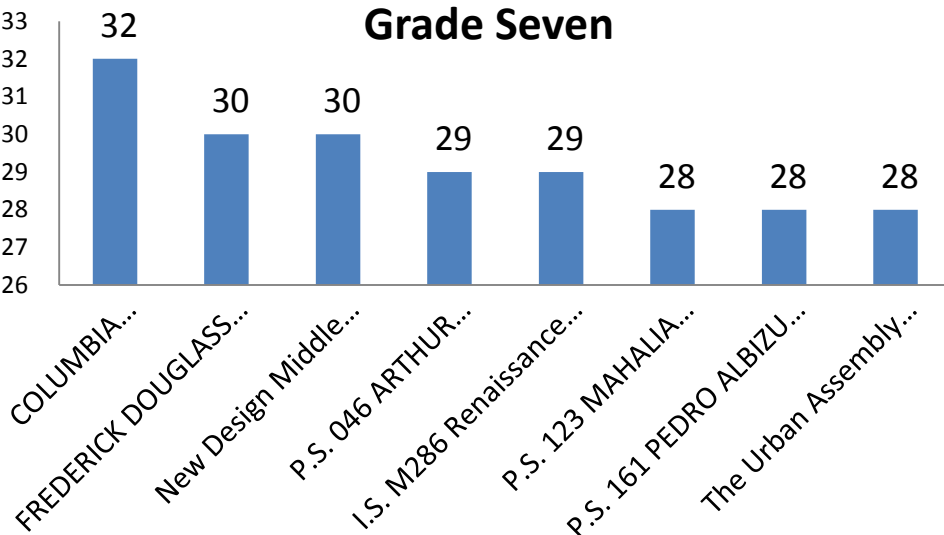

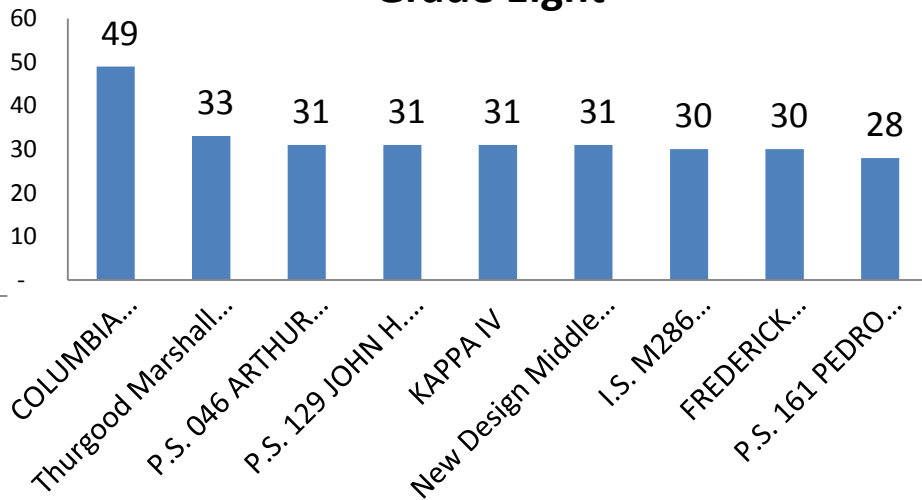

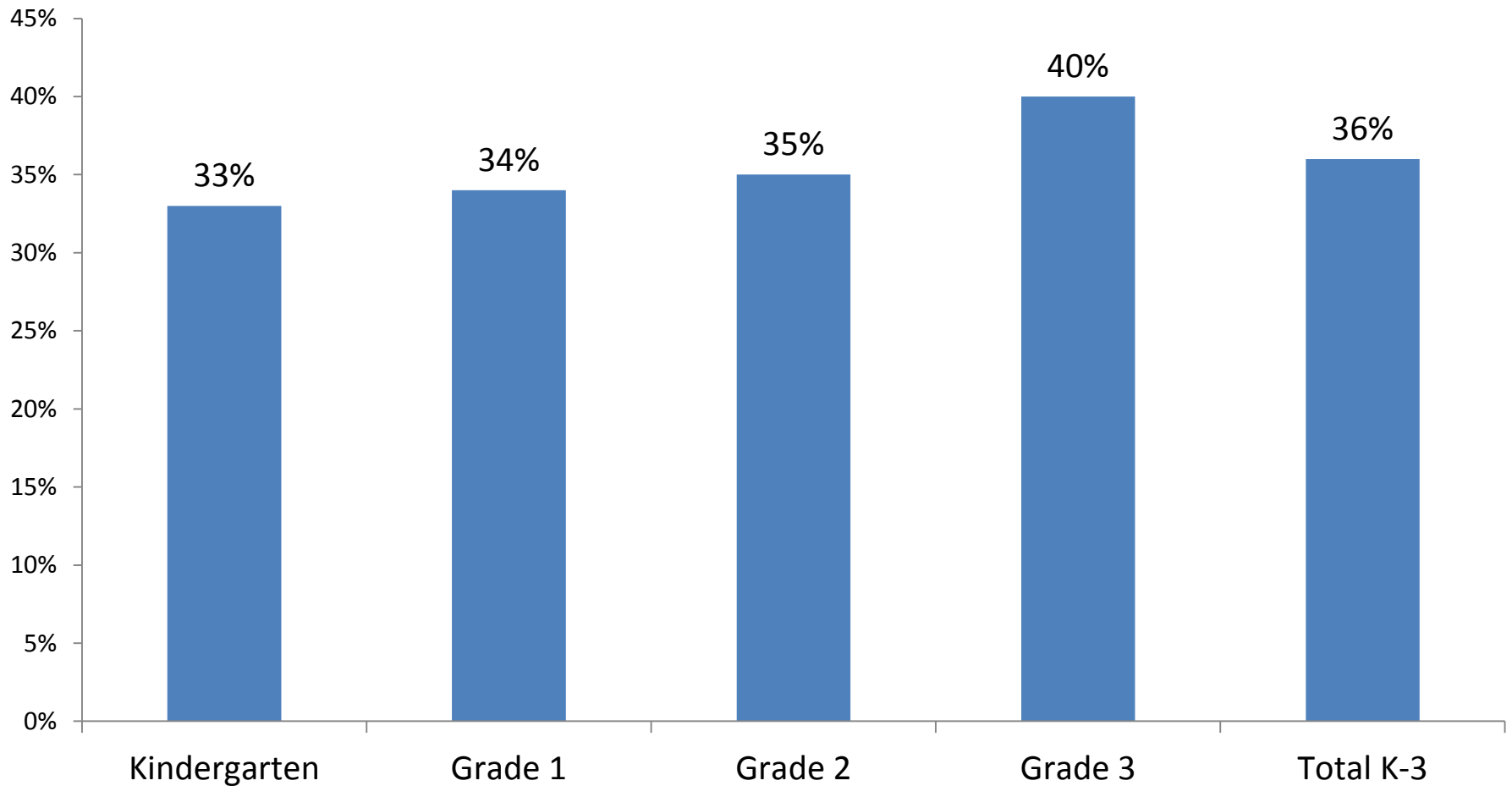

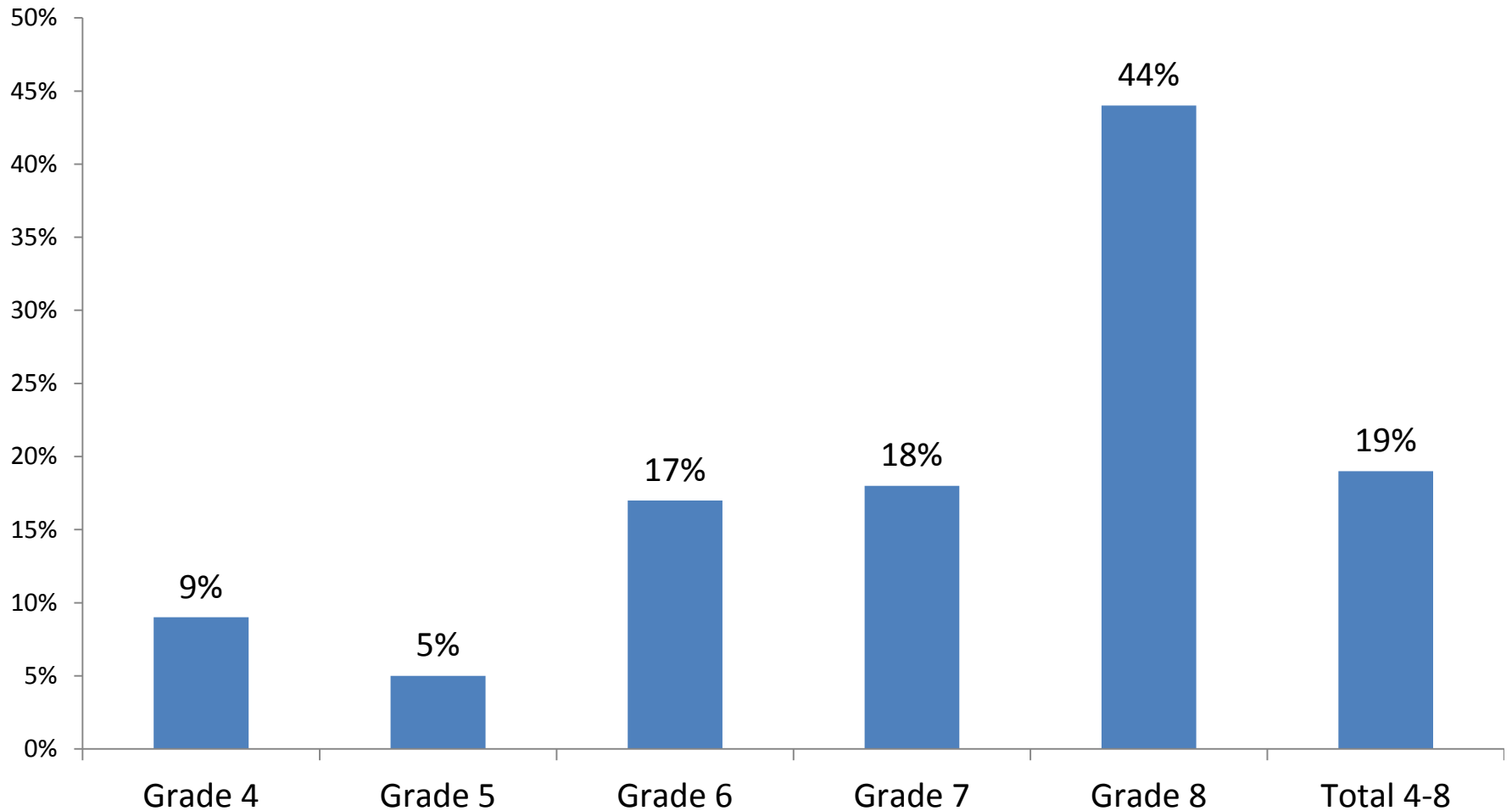


Percent of D5 K-3 students in a class of 25 or more 2014-15 school year

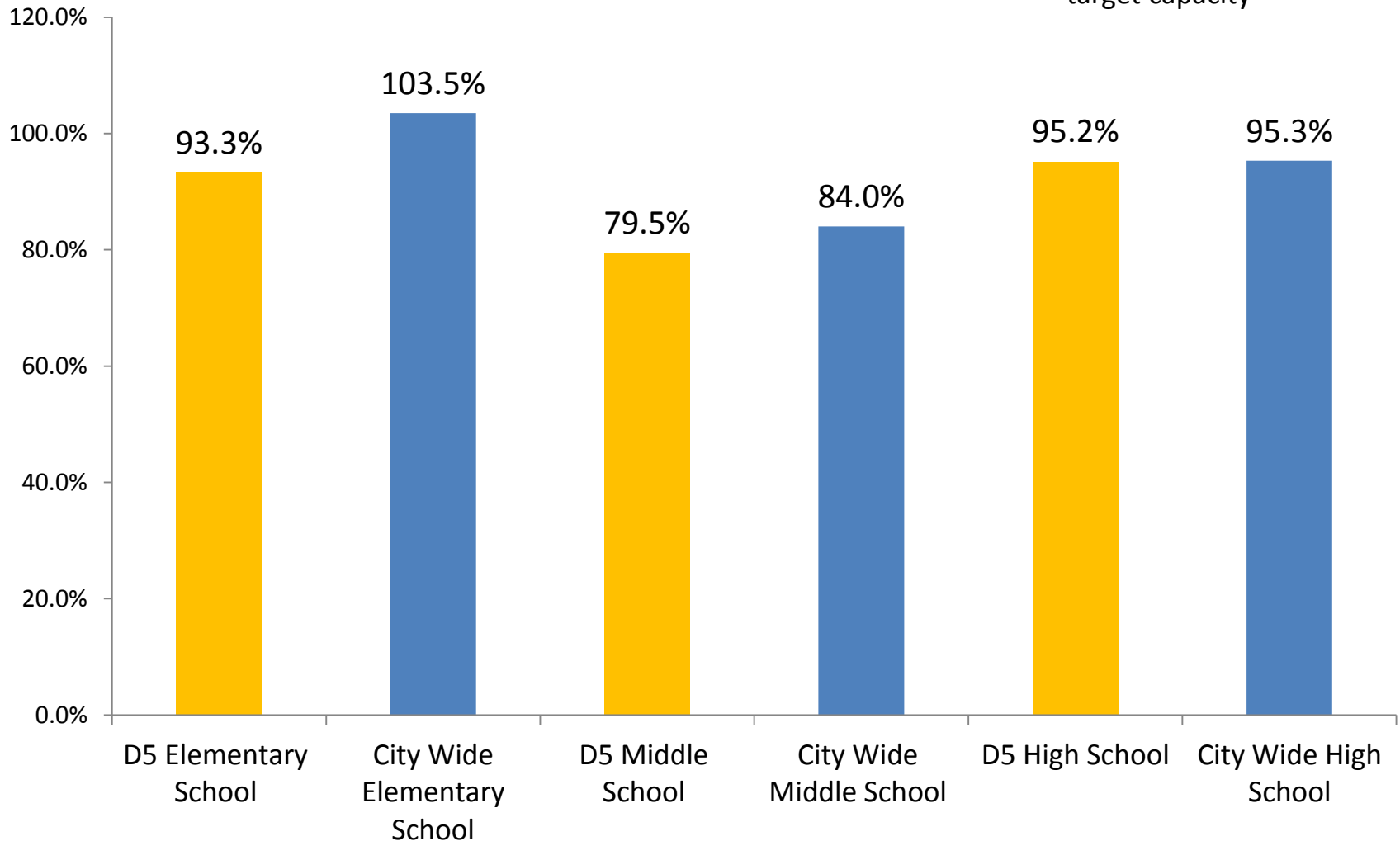
Percent of D5 4-8 students in a class of 30 or more in the 2015-16 school year

Average School Utilization Rates in D5 are less than City-Wide
