1. My name is Naila Rosario, and I live in the County of Richmond, City and State of New York. My daughter L.R. is entering the 12th grade next year at the Gaynor McCown

Expeditionary Learning School, which is a New York City Public School located on Staten Island, New York.

2. My child's experience of virtual learning during the pandemic was very negative, both academically and emotionally, and I am very opposed to the idea that my daughter or any New York City student could be assigned to online classes without full parental knowledge and consent.

3. I was glad to hear that the State Education Department issued regulations requiring parental consent, but then was genuinely concerned when I heard about the New York City Department of Education's Guidance that says they can assign students to online learning even if they have not heard back from parents and have not received their explicit written consent.

- 4. Allowing the DOE to assign and place students in online classes without parental consent will not only conflict with the state regulations, but also risk undermining the quality of education for thousands of New York City students like my daughter, who needs and deserves the close feedback and personal connections that only in-person classes can provide.
- 5. Since the State Education Department has approved regulations that require prior parental consent, I urge the Commissioner to see that they are rigorously enforced, and to mandate that the DOE put out new guidance emphasizing the need **in all cases** for prior, verifiable parent consent before any student is placed in an online class.
